When absolutely necessary, we are asking Year 12 and Year 13 learners to self manage without a teacher or reliever in the room. They have work to get on with during this time.

Our enrolment process for 2023 is underway with a tour of the campus and an information evening today, Wednesday 3 August. The tour starts from the Admin building at 6 pm, the information evening will be in our Auditorium from 7 pm. We also have learners from our contributing primary schools visiting us on Wednesday and Thursday this week.

We have a Staff Only Day on Tuesday 16 August. This is one of the 8 'Accord Days' provided by the Government to plan for and begin to implement the revised NCEA changes that are underway. For us, we are well underway with this planning and have implemented some of the changes as pilots, namely in numeracy for our half of Year 10 learners completing an Achievement standard at the end of Term 2. In our full school (online) assembly last week, I shared the expectations we have around uniforms and attendance with the learners. ICAS English

Previously, learners logged into the school network using a generic user name and password. From Term 3 and onwards, learners now log into the network using their personal log-in details (the same ones they are currently using for Google Classroom/Gmail and Drive).

Please find here detailed instructions on how to log in.

Every day, we see a large number of learners whose devices are not connecting to our network and who are, as a result, missing important learning time. Most of the time, these problems are associated with necessary updates not being installed. So, please remind your child to re-start their device regularly and install all necessary updates so they can optimise their learning time in class.

ICAS Assessments are being held in August.

The ICAS Assessment series is designed to assess a learner's ability to apply classroom learning in new contexts, using higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills. The questions in the ICAS Competition are a training ground for the core skills at the heart of STEM. In tracking them, learners build the type of creative problem solving, discernment and analytical thinking that will prove essential to future employers. Attendance Matters



What Parents & Caregivers need to do

- Support and encourage your learner to have high attendance at school.
- Contact the school if your learner is ill via email: absences@wgpcollege.school.nz or phone: 424 9177. Illness absences over 5 days, requires supporting documentation.
- All 7-13 learners must sign out at reception before leaving the school. An email or phone call from home outlining the reason is required before the learner can leave.
- If you need to collect your learner during the school day, please contact reception in advance so that we are able to get them out of class in a timely manner.
- Please remember that you are able to check your child/the learner's attendance on the Parent Portal.

Support you should expect from our school

- Kaiārahi will phone home if we have not heard from you regarding your child/the learner's absence.
- Kaiārahi will contact you, if your your child/the learner has missed periods in the school day.
- The Dean will contact you if your child/the learner is showing signs of ongoing truancy or if we have not heard from you regarding ongoing absences.
- A Deputy Principal will invite you into school for a meeting to discuss ongoing attendance or truancy concerns.
- The school may refer your child/the learner to external support agencies in the case of ongoing attendance issues. These may include: Attendance Support Services, Truancy Officer, Rock on, Managed Moves & Northern Health School.

Please work with the school attendance staff in a polite and positive manner, we are all working together to support each learner.

From The Nurse

HOW WGP COLLEGE SUPPORTS LEARNER HAUORA (WELLBEING)

- We have a team of experienced guidance counsellors <u>counsellors@wgpcollege.school.nz</u>
- We have a registered nurse on staff <u>nurse@wgpcollege.school.nz</u> who can complete assessments for mental health, eating disorders, drug and alcohol use, concussion screens.
- We offer Boostrix immunisation to Year 7's (with parental consent) scheduled for 18 August .
- We offer HPV vaccinations to Year 8's (with parental consent). HPV 2 due 17 November .
- We have a visiting physio 3 days per week and a hand therapist 2 days per week (hand therapy free under ACC) .
- The Auckland Regional Dental Service provides dental care to our Year 7 and 8 learners who are enrolled (Term 1 and 2).
- Lumino mobile dental van provides dental care to enrolled Year 9 13 learners who are enrolled Term 1.
- Vision checks for Year 7 learners are on 22 August .
- Year 7 and Year 8 (catchup) WDHB vision testing.
- Year 9 Free Hearing tests— This is an opt out service, if you do not consent for your child to participate, please email courtneybr@wgpcollege.school.nz by 8 August.

Physiotherapy and Hand Therapy

We have a physiotherapist onsite 3 days per week to treat learners and staff. Under ACC and with a referral from the school nurse, the first treatment is free and further treatments are \$10.

We have a hand therapist onsite 2 days per week. All treatment under ACC is free.

If the school nurse is referring a learner to the physio or hand therapist, she will get permission from parents / caregivers.

UNWELL LEARNERS

If your child is unwell with obvious symptoms, please keep them home until their symptoms improve. If a learner has a persistent cough, they can return to school when they are able to manage to get themselves outside to cough.

If your child becomes unwell at school with Covid-29 symptoms, you will be contacted to collect them.

If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to isolate for 7 days (including day 0).

If the result is negative and symptoms persist, your child will need to retest. They can return to school if negative, when symptoms have improved.

LEARNERS WITH MILD SYMPTOMS AT SCHOOL

If learners present to the Health Clinic with mild standalone symptoms, then the school nurse may opt to do a R.A.T to determine if they are able to return to class.

If the result is positive, whānau will be contacted to collect the learner. Whānau will need to record the positive result on "My Covid Record" or call 0800222478 if the child is under 12.

The nurse has a limited supply of moon cups and period pants available FREE.

MASK WEARING

Facemasks continue to be a tool that helps reduce the spread of Covid-19 and other winter illnesses. WGP College strongly recommends the continued use of face masks at school. We are trying to reduce the spread of Covid and other winter illness by:

- Encouraging facemask use indoors
- Keeping classrooms well ventilated (please ensure your child has warm uniform to wear)
- Encouraging good hand hygiene practices (including hand washing and sanitiser)
- Encouraging good cough/sneeze etiquette
- Asking staff and learners to stay home if unwell
- Supplying and encouraging regular use of surface cleaners in our classrooms

INFORMING WHĀNAU OF UNWELL LEARNERS

The process for unwell learners at WGP College is for them to present to the Health Clinic for assessment by the school Registered Nurse. In many instances the school RN can provide treatment to support the learner to remain at school.

Learners should NOT be contacting home to be collected when unwell. The school RN will contact families if concerned or the learner needs to be collected.

This process supports learners with attendance, and it supports working parents.

EnviroGroup

This weekend the EnviroGroup had the opportunity to help with planting along the edge of Amorino Park in Red Beach. Near where new houses had been built there had been a bank collapse. We were asked to help stabilise it by planting some natives above the bank and some along the collapsed edge. Using a few different species of native plants, we got to work. Along the top, a mixture of kōwhai, hebe, and flax were planted while primarily mānuka plants have been used along the bank, with some others added sparingly. Due to the incline of the bank, it was a very difficult job (with many near-falls) but we're proud to have accomplished it.

If this sounds interesting to you, or you are otherwise interested in helping out with our local environment, Whangaparaoa College's EnviroGroup meets every Friday (or so) at lunchtime in S2, and new members are always welcome! That's anyone from Year 7 to Year 13, and staff. We run a variety of environment-based initiatives, ranging from pest control to rubbish clean-ups.


Rosie Risbrook (Head Girl) Spirit of Adventure


