At our Year 7 Assembly this week I will be explaining the meaning of our school crest and motto, and thought it would be good to make sure our whole school community shared the understanding.



The Whale's Tail is symbolic of our Whangaparaoa area. The literal translation is "Bay of Whales". Whales group in pods, dive deep, take on challenges and look after each other. The Whale represents strength and working together.

Thus, we get the first part of our motto – Ngatahi (Together)



The Nikau Palm is New Zealand's only native palm. The seedlings on the floor of the forest are very small and vulnerable; but grow tall, strong and have a long life. Its abundant fruit supports many native birds. The Nikau Palm represents growth, confidence and belief. Thus, Whakapono (Believe)



The Kotuku or white heron is a beautiful bird. The feathers traditionally adorn Maori cloaks as a symbol of excellence and high achievement. The Kotuku symbolises looking to the future and reaching great heights, which gives us the third word of our motto Tutuki (Achieve)

### **Online Safety**

Whangaparaoa College recognises the increasing role that the internet is playing in our learners lives. We believe that education is the best policy when it comes to helping our learners stay safe, comfortable, mindful, and empowered in their online dealings with each other and the wider world. As such, as part of our active improvement plan, Kaiārahi will be taking their Rōpū Whānau through an Online Behaviour and Safety programme this year. The programme will cover expectations for learner online interaction and strategies to help learners navigate the digital world with confidence and assurance.

Topics will include: Sending or posting sexual images and texts; watching, viewing, and/or sharing inappropriate content; conducting safe online relationships and online bullying.

### NCEA 2021 at Whangaparaoa College

#### NCEA Level 1:

Last year we were reminded by NZQA of the flexibility inherent in the NCEA qualification, and that it is not necessary for learners to gain NCEA Level 1 before doing Level 2. Historically, more than 96% of Whangaparaoa College learners gain Level 2. So, for them, Level 1 is not important as a qualification, but serves as a foundation for Level 2. We provide alternative pathways for the few learners for whom NCEA Level 2 is not a realistic goal. So, for 2021, Year 11 learners at Whangaparaoa College will be expected to achieve:

- 20 credits at Level 1 (including literacy and numeracy)
- Examination experience during Term 1, we will consider how best to give learners the opportunity to experience internal and external exams

#### NCEA Level 2:

- Learners will gain 80 credits (20 from Level 1 the previous year, plus an additional 60 from Level 2)
- Learners will gain University Entrance (UE) Literacy

#### NCEA Level 3:

- Learners will gain 80 credits (20 from Level 2, plus an additional 60 from Level 3)
- Learners capable of gaining their UE will be strongly encouraged to gain this and guided to a suitable programme to enable this. For UE, learners will need 14 credits in each of three university approved subjects, plus their UE Literacy and Level 1 Numeracy; and their NCEA Level 3.

#### **Resubmissions:**

If a teacher deems it appropriate, learners resubmit work. However, from 2021, learners can only resubmit an assessment to go from Not Achieved to Achieved. They are unable to resub for Merit or Excellence.

Year 11-13 learners have had the above information outlined to them in their last assembly. Kaiārahi and subject teachers will be ensuring that learners know that they need to achieve and are progressing well.

#### Free STAR Courses

#### Free STAR courses available to senior learners in 2021.

STAR courses are commonly known as "Taster" courses, usually 1-3 days, during the school holidays. The STAR courses offer a fun, practical way of having a taste of the industry and possibly also offer NCEA credits. For more information email natashadu@wgpcollege.school.nz

Congratulations to those WGP College learners who managed to complete most of their events away at the National Surf Lifesaving Competition at Mount Maunganui prior to the lockdown.



Try-out days for Year 7/8 Zone Days took place in Week 3 and the teams will be heading out over the next few weeks to represent the college in tag, futsal, swimming and triathlon.

#### House

This term kicked off with three days of House events for the Year 7's and 8's. The highlight of the start-up was tabloid sports with learners competing in classic obstacle course races, bucket fills, and bucket planks. All year groups competed and the House spirit was awesome to see. # **Upcoming Immunisations**

Year 8 - HPV1 on 20 May 2021, HPV2 on 15 November 2021

Year 7 - Boostrix on 19 August 2021

As part of the national immunisation schedule, all Year 8 learners will be offered the opportunity to be immunised against the HPV virus at school.

Information and a consent form has been sent home with your child. Learners have been shown an information video in class.

All Year 7 learners will be offered the opportunity to receive Boostrix (tetanus, diphtheria and whooping cough).

Year 7 learners have also been shown a video in class and consent forms have been sent home.

Please complete the form and return it to your childs Kaiārahi.

It is important that the form is completed whether or not you give consent. If they have already received the immunisation, or you wish to take them to your family practice for the free immunisations, please complete Part B, the Non-Consent part of the form. This helps with the administration process of the programme.
