



Attendance

Under the Education Act, attendance at school is compulsory, unless the learner is unable to attend because of sickness, danger of infection, sudden and serious illness of a parent.

Learners are not permitted to leave the school grounds during the lunch break. Only Year 13 learners with study either side of the lunch break are allowed to leave the school grounds.

If your child needs to leave school during the day, please ensure they have a note to show their teacher and bring this to Admin to sign out. If a non-caregiver/parent is collecting your child, please include this information in the note or phone the school to advise this prior to collection.
