During the recent holiday break, we heard the sad news that our former head of Phys Ed, Mr Brad Milne passed away suddenly as the result of a medical situation. Our thoughts are with his family.

Covid-19

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I want to acknowledge the response of our community to the Covid-19 pandemic. It is not over, but I think it is important to recognise its impact – which is ongoing for many. Also, the way people of all ages have supported each other and shown resilience has been amazing. While we need to be ready for possible changes in the Covid Alert level, we can be very grateful to be in New Zealand. We have friends in Ireland (a country with a similar population to New Zealand), where they had 1263 new cases just yesterday. We can look at the statistics, and think about the effects of nearly any other country – and be grateful.

As you will be aware through the media, there has been a member of the public test positive for Covid-19 (in the last 48 hours). Although this may not directly affect our community, as a school community, with our other local schools, we would like to reiterate that we always take the care and health of our staff and learners very seriously. Please ensure you continue to ask your children to adhere to Covid-19 protocols at school and when they are in our community. The following is a reminder of school protocols:

- If your child is sick or showing any signs of the symptoms of Covid-19 (runny nose, cough, loss of sense of smell etc), please keep your child at home and seek medical advice immediately.
 - If your child presents with any symptoms during the school day, we will be calling you to collect them as soon as possible.
- When visiting our school, please ensure that you report to reception and use the Covid-19 Tracer APP before entering, then move straight to our 'sign in station' to follow and adhere to our instructions for sign in.
- We regularly remind staff and learners of our health and safety routines that we have put in place here at Whangaparaoa College. All Principals are being carefully guided by the Ministry of Education.

Thank you for your on-going support and being a responsible citizen in doing our part to keep our community safe and healthy. The little things really do matter, so let's continue to wash our hands, sneeze into our elbow, stay home (and get tested) if unwell, and be kind! Take care.

Own it! Fix it! Change it!

"My bad" is a great wee statement which was not heard when I was growing up. It's a way to take ownership when we slip up in some way. At assemblies I've been talking about the need to 'fess up when we mess up'. This is not just something for our tamariki (children) – but for all of us. Around the College we have posters that encourage everyone to "Own it! Fix it! Change it!" when we make mistakes. The "Own it!" is simply accepting responsibility; putting our hand up. "Fix it!" is about doing what we can to put things right, and should almost always start with an apology. "Change it!" refers to the need to be different next time. It's simple and effective. Try it with your kids when the time is right.


