## From the Principal's Desk

As you may know, I like to tell stories at assemblies that hopefully help people understand and/or remember the point of my message. Some prefects have asked me to put one of these stories down in print – so here we go. This is the story of about the wee satchel I had when I started primary school, way back in the early 1960's. ## **House Cup**




## Carparks, Drop-off and Pick-up Zones


