

This project was built by **Alexander Winks in Year 12** for his NCEA course task. (Materials were either donated or recycled).

The table is a thick Macrocarpa slab inlaid with shells found by my grandmother from around the coast, over the years she has lived here, and they are sealed in with layers of epoxy. The epoxy not only seals the wood and shells for years to come, but also makes the grain of the wood "pop" - as you can mainly see from the thinner end of the top.

I built this table so it could be auctioned and hopefully sold, to raise funds for the NZ Cancer Society. I also did this in memory of my grandfather, who sadly passed away from cancer a few years ago. I don't want anyone to have the hardship of having cancer or seeing another pass away from it.


