From the Principal's Desk

Focusing on Teaching and Learning

We have been aware for some time that New Zealand Secondary Schools tend to have too much assessment which distracts from time spent teaching and learning. We seem to have too many assignments, tests, projects etc, and we often make them more complex than they need to be. We want to ensure a quality of educational achievement more than a large quantity of credit accumulation.

To this end, in 2020 we will reduce the quantity and volume of assessments. For example, learners in each senior course can gain up to 18 credits per course. This will in no way hinder the options learners have going forward. It is more likely to improve their prospects as they will have more 'merit' and 'excellence' credits as part of the 80 credits they need for each level of NCEA.

Bullying Prevention and Response Action Group

In an earlier newsletter I shared how we are using an external facilitator to work with a small group of staff and learners to examine our policies and practices in relation to the prevention and response to bullying. Last term there was a comprehensive survey of our learners that was developed by the New Zealand Centre for Educational Research. In a nutshell, we are like every school in New Zealand in that there are incidents of bullying at our school. The survey results showed that our school culture and climate is similar to most other schools; and in some ways better. The group is looking at specific areas in which we can further improve.

New Zealand Curriculum Requirements

I often hear educators from other countries say that our New Zealand Curriculum is an outstanding document and they would love to have something similar for their own country. While our curriculum gives lots of flexibility, there are some compulsory aspects, eg: values, key competencies, literacy, numeracy, and the assurance that there is a range of knowledge, skills and understandings covered. Our national curriculum does not place any subject area as more important than another; and no subjects are compulsory for senior learners. At Whangaparaoa we recognise the importance of reading and writing; and these literacy skills will continue to be compulsory (as they are nationally) and available in a wide range of our subjects. English will not be a compulsory NCEA Level 1 subject in 2020. Numeracy skills are still strongly linked with Maths courses which will continue to be compulsory for NCEA Level 1 learners. We want our learners to have flexibility while ensuring their pathways and opportunities are wide open.

School Ball

Last Saturday we had our School Ball. This was a special occasion where many of our Year 12 and 13 learners dressed up and enjoyed a wonderful night of fun, dancing, excellent food and glamour. At all previous School Balls, we have been complemented by the staff working at the venue for the maturity and respect shown by our learners. This happened again on Saturday night. We have high expectations of those attending the Ball – and they certainly lived up to our expectations.


Midwinter Community Ball


