PEER SMART AT WHANGAPARAOA COLLEGE By Libby Williams 24-7 Youth Worker

Peer Smart is a 5 week course for intermediates, run at Whangaparaoa College by the junior youth workers at CYC Trust. This term, I am taking six Year 7 girls through the program. Peer Smart is about learning how to cope with everyday life. As a group we learn how to bounce back from difficult situations or from things that might hurt us. We also learn how important it is to talk to someone and not bottle things up. Through this we learn how we can be good friends and be more understanding of others.

As a youth worker, it is important to me to create a safe place where these girls get the opportunity to share things that maybe they haven't felt comfortable enough to share before. Every time I've run this program the group dynamics are different. I adapt how the activities are run and how we talk about certain topics to meet the needs of each group.

This term, the six girls that are doing the program already know each other. I still believe this program will help them grow closer and understand each other more. It's also important that there is space for the girls to grow as individuals and learn more about themselves as well.

My prayer is that each one of these girls has a really positive experience with Peer Smart and can leave feeling like they can handle those inevitable tough situations better. They grow, I grow as well, everyone wins!
