From the Principal's Desk

It was recently reported in the media that a school will ban learners (up to Year 10) from bringing a phone to the school. One of the key reasons given was that the learners are distracted by having access to the technology. This of course has prompted folk to ask what our position is with regard cell phones at school.

At Whangaparaoa College, learners are allowed to bring smartphones to school; but phones must be in bags before learners enter class, and remain there for the duration of every class. While banning phones may reduce some distractions, it will not help our young ones learn to self-manage the technology – that is very much a part of our world. We also realise many parents want their children to have phones so they can keep connected for family reasons.

Be assured that our learners cannot access Instagram, SnapChat, WhatsApp and unacceptable sites via the school WiFi system because we have blocked many sites. Cell phones may not be used during class time and if they are, there are consequences, including having the phone confiscated.

Some parents are concerned their children have been involved with social media 'spats' while at school. Let me assure you that this can't happen via our school network. Parents, you have all the control here:

- You choose if you want your child to have a smartphone.
- You choose if you want your child to bring it to school.

3. You choose if your child has a data package which enables them to access social media sites, and pretty much anything else on the Net.

If you do not want your child to have access to certain areas of the internet, I suggest you remove their phone, or do not let them bring it to school, or do not allow them to have a data package. On this last point – text messaging and phone calls still work as a means of communication.

One other thing; can you please talk with your children (at the appropriate age/stage) about 'sex-ting' and other sexually inappropriate social media activities. I realise this might be embarrassing; but I believe it is important. If you want any support with this matter, Netsafe have a well-resourced website, https://www.netsafe.org.nz/. Maybe start with a coaching conversation at dinner-time with your family about the positives and negatives of internet access.




Put on your dancing shoes and join us for an unforgettable night at *Dreams - The Fleetwood Mac Experience*.
