From the Principal

Attendance: One of the most basic elements for a successful time at school is attendance. The average attendance at Whangaparaoa College is currently 90%. While that is a good score in a test or exam and a lot better than the national average; it means that every learner at our College has on average one day off a fortnight. This is very concerning. Interestingly, the largest category of 'justification' for lack of attendance is 'medical'. I know we have coughs and colds in winter and there are also serious medical issues with which some people battle. However, to increase our attendance we need to improve the overall well-being of our young ones. There are four essentials – lots of positive contact with others, plenty of exercise, nutritious food, and 9-10 hours of sleep each night – that will help improve and maintain the wellbeing of children and young adults on the Peninsula. Let's work together and make a concerted effort with this, and we'll see the attendance rate improve.

Facial Expressions: Have you ever wondered why your teenage son or daughter thinks you are angry or grumpy or (as they say these days) a bit 'salty'? Some fascinating research has shown that during adolescence, when your son or daughter's brain is undergoing considerable change, they are very challenged when it comes to interpreting facial expressions. In fact, apart from being able to recognise that a smile is positive, the teenage brain views almost every other expression as being grumpy. I am learning to keep this in mind when I show surprise, puzzlement, excitement, consternation, concern, compassion, etc. I will very likely be misinterpreted, and this applies at home and school. A beaming, friendly smile, however, is always recognised, even if sometimes our child will wonder what we want!

MoE Reviews: You will be aware from the media that the Ministry of Education are currently involved with a number of very important reviews, including Tomorrow's Schools, NCEA, provision and maintenance of school property, and workforce requirements and well-being. 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- It is been a real pleasure in the last week to learn of the success of our Rockquest band. Sam Wilcox-Brown, James McGurk and Michael Johnston won the Auckland regional competition, and are now writing new material to submit for their National's performance.
- One of our League of Legends teams has won the ten week National Challenger Series, which involved numerous schools and hundreds of teams. League of Legends is an online strategy game, where two teams of five have to attack their opponent's 'fort', while defending their own. It sounds a little like 'Storm the Heights' which was a game we used to play at camps with 20 to 30 people on each team, trying to capture an opposing team's flag from one hill-top while defending our own flag on another. Our Senior Choir performed and received a standing ovation at last week's Big Sing competition. At Monday morning's teacher briefing we were treated to a beautiful performance by our Senior Choir who presented their rendition of Sting's 'Shape of the Heart'.

As always, life is busy and at the moment, we have the Learner Led Conferences coming up, NCEA assessments coming out of our ears, the winter sports programme is well into its second half, and a school break is on the horizon. Keep well, and please let's focus on the wellness of our kids with nutrition, exercise, sleep, and lots of positive interactions.
