From the Principal

Feedback from visitors

Over the last week we have had a number of groups visiting from overseas, from other NZ schools, and also from our own community. One of these groups were not really visitors as they were the Trustees who serve on our Board. They may know details of the finance, policies, property and other governance aspects of our fine school, but it was good to have them shown around during class time by some of our learners. Their feedback – and that of other visitors – was very similar:

- "Everything is very calm."
- "You feel a sense of purpose from both the learners and teachers."
- "The place is looking great."
 - "The kids are happy."

We know we don't get everything right all the time, but we try; and it was very encouraging to receive such positive feedback from a range of sources.

Accepting and supporting others

One of our core values is respect. At Whangaparaoa College we believe it is important that we have respect for others, respect for ourselves and respect for the environment. A couple of ways we see respect in action is by the way we accept and support others. We are all different – and how we treat others is a measure of how we are as a person, and as a school. This applies in face-to-face situations and also in the digital environment. Our learners were asked, "What does respect look like?" and their answers are presented on a poster that can be seen around the school. Examples are:

Learners have until **27 May** to order, and take advantage of the free delivery to our College for their collection.


They may still order after this date, however, there will be a delivery charge by Photolife for the photo to be sent home.

We made, packed and delivered close to 2000 lunches to school children from dozens of different Auckland Primary, Intermediate and Senior schools.

We also had the pleasure of re-connecting with Mangere Central Primary School, to hand out these lunches during break time, and who also kindly allowed us to stay, assist and interact with their Year 1-8 learners during class time.
